Relief requested: Renew exemption for a two-year duration from 49 U.S.C. § 41301 to engage in:

- a. Foreign scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail from any point or points behind any Member State of the European Union, via any point or points behind any Member State of the European Union, via any point or points in any EU Member State and via intermediate points, to any point or points in the United States and beyond; and;
- b. Foreign scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail between any point or points in the United States and any point or points in any member of the European Common Aviation Area.
